

Shannon Martin (PC) – MLA for Morris

Shannon Martin was first elected January 28, 2014, as the Member of the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba for the Morris Constituency.

Prior to becoming the MLA for Morris, he was Executive Director at Reaching E-Quality Employment Services, a not-for-profit that helps persons with physical disabilities or health conditions find and maintain employment.

Prior to that he was Director of Provincial Affairs for the Canadian Federation of Independent Business, an organization dedicated to giving voice to the small-and medium-sized businesses that make up the backbone of the provincial economy.

An outspoken commentator of provincial government long before his election, Shannon has written dozens of op-eds in the pages of local newspapers on such diverse topics as the payroll tax, government's addiction to gambling revenues and debt and deficit.

As someone who grew up in rural Manitoba, Shannon has always appreciated the quality of life available and the importance of community engagement. Shannon resides in La Salle and has coached youth soccer as well as volunteering to sit as a Director-at-large on the La Salle Community Centre Board of Directors.
